I hope 2018 has been a numismaticly rewarding year so far. Each year, as I'm reorganizing my collection, I like to notice which coins are reaching a significant anniversary since being struck. Here's a few of the more interesting ones I came across this year:

1,820 years: Silver denarius of Roman Emperor Septimius Severus (198 AD) 1,750 years: Roman antoninianus issued by the rebel general Aureolus (268 AD)

400 years: Silver rupee of the Mughal Empire (1618)

190 years: My oldest large cent (1828) 160 years: The last flying eagle cents (1858) 150 years: My oldest nickel five cent (1868) 140 years: My oldest silver dollar (1878 CC)

130 years: A tiny copper penni from Finland under Russian rule (1888)

125 years: A Columbian Expo commemorative half dollar (1893)

100 years: A British farthing of George V (1918)

80 years: The last buffalo nickels, and first Jefferson nickels (1938)

75 years: Steel pennies! (1943)

50 years: Ten dong from South Vietnam (1968)

40 years: The last Ike dollars (1978)

30 years: The first Australian \$2 coin (1988)

25 years: Italy commemorative 200 lire/ The year I began collecting coins (1993)

20 years: My first Silver Eagle (1998)

10 years: The last Statehood Quarters (2008)

It's hard to believe that the "youngest" State Quarters are ten years-old now! I'm feeling old. I'd better spend some more time with my ancient coins to at least feel young by comparison! Anyway, hope you enjoyed this glimpse into my eclectic "hopeless generalist" collection.


